Cousins, Separated 51 Years, Together Again

ALHAMBRA — A reunion after 51 years was held this week by two sisters, Mrs. Mary Libery, 1112 Geranio Dr., and Mrs. Vincent Casciato, 1117 Azalea Dr., with their first cousin, John Di Florio, of Ely, Nevada.

The two sisters, Mrs. Libery, 66, and Mrs. Casciato, 70 before they married came to the United States from S'Peitro, Italy, in their late teens in 1902 with their parents, Mr. and Mrs. Pasquale Mastiani and settled in Youngstown, Ohio.

Di Florio, 63, a retired railroad man, came to this country by himself in 1904 and visited the

Mastrianis before going on to live with his two brothers in Ely, where he later married.

In the meantime, Mary and Angelina married and remained in Youngstown where each gave birth to five children. Mrs. Casciato had three girls and two boys, and Mrs. Libery, three boys and two girls.

Several years after their parents' death, Mr. and Mrs. Casciato and Mrs. Libery, who had become a widow, moved to Alhambra, California.

Mrs. Libery came first, nine years ago. Two years later the Casciatos arrived.
