MASTRIANA — Frank A., a Prominent Attorney, of Sea Ranch Lakes passed away Monday, August 26, 1991 at his residence of heart failure. After brief services, Mastriana was returned to Youngstown, OH. Born in Youngstown on April 3, 1916, Mastriana was the son of Union Savings and Trust Co. founder, Frank Mastriana and Orsalina Federici. He received his Bachelor's Degree from the University of Notre Dame in 1939 and his Law Degree from Ohio State University in 1941. After being admitted to the Ohio Bar Association during that year, he returned to Youngstown to practice law with his sister, Attorney Anne Mastriana. At that time, they were the only brother-sister law firm in the state. In 1943, he accepted a position in the United States Justice Department. In 1945, Mastriana resumed private practice with the Edward J. DeBartolo Corporation becoming one of his major clients. By 1952, his involvement with DeBartolo was so extensive that Mastriana closed his private law practice and accepted a position with the corporation as Vice-President and General Counsel until he retired in 1976. Mastriana, honored by the Ohio Bar Association for 50 years of service this past spring, was also a member of both the American and Mahoning County Bar Associations. He was a member of the Summa Club of the Notre Dame Foundation as well as the Notre Dame Law Association Council. Actively involved in the community, Mastriana was a founding member of the Ursuline Century II Club; a Trustee of the Mahoning County Crippled Children and Adults Foundation and a member of the Executive Council for the Youngstown Area Service Foundation and Knights of Columbus Council 274. Mastriana, an avid golfer, participated in many charitable golf outings. He was a member of Coral Ridge Country Club in Ft. Lauderdale and Tippecanoe Country Club in Canfield. Married to the former Eileen Montani in 1944, Mastriana is survived by his wife and their three children, Attorney Ron Mastriana of Ft. Lauderdale, Mrs. Lynne Christiansen of Ft. Lauderdale and Mrs. Ruth DiRienzo of Boardman, OH and five grandchildren, Brian, Gina, Eric, Alena Marie and Gregory. He is also survived by a brother, Fred Mastriana of Boardman, OH as
