Well-known teacher, pianist; member of symphony board

Mrs. Rose L. Mastriana, 77, of 111 Brainard Drive, died of a heart ailment Sunday evening at home after a lengthy illness.

Mrs. Mastriana was born Sept. 4, 1914, in Niles, a daughter of Leonard and Christina Cantasano Fusco. She was a Niles McKinley High School graduate, a 1936 Cleveland Institute of Music graduate, and studied at Dana School of Music at Youngstown State University.

She was a well-known teacher and pianist in the area for 35 years, and was a member of the Youngstown Symphony, having served on its board.

She was a member and former director of the Monday Musical Club, had served as past president of the Market Street School PTA, was a member of the Cheerio All Girls Orchestra of Niles, was associ-

ated with the Strouss School of Music, and entertained at various area nursing homes. She did volunteer work both the heart and cancer associations and the Western Reserve Care System. She was a member of St. Charles Church.

She leaves her husband, Fred P., whom she married July 15, 1940; three sons, F. Paul and Atty. Richard J., both of Boardman, and Robert A. of Poland; two brothers, Frank A. Fusco of Toronto, Canada, and Fred L. Fusco of Boardman; a sister, Mrs. Josephine Morgan of St. Catharines, Canada; and four grandchildren.

A brother, Edward A., is deceased.
